A fillustering expedition, numbering 200 men, is reported to have innded near Gibara, on the northern coast of Cuba. On tacir way into the interior they were attacked by the Spaniards, loosing eighty men in Eilied and wounded and two pieces of artillery. The Spanish loss is stated at thirty-two. Survengating is reported near Thinidad and Cicafuegos, with heavy loss on both sides. Both Spaniards and Cubara are committing the most appriling and Cubara sare committing the most appriling

atrocities, and small bands are raiding over the country killing and robbing the inhabitants. The reported defeat of the Spanish forces attempting to reopen the railroad to Puerto Principe is fully confirmed. The loss of the Spaniards is put down at 1.000 men killed and wounded, who were left in the hands of the Cubans. The patriot forces captured ten cars laden with provisions, arms and ammunition. During the battle 400 negro troops in the Spanish service shot their officers and went Over to the Cohang.
