

NASSAU.

Return of the Salvador from the Cuban Coast—Her Passengers and Cargo Safely Landed—Seizure of the Steamer by the Authorities.

KEY WEST, May 24, 1869.

News from Nassau to the 21st instant has been received here,

On the 8th the English steamer Salvador, which suddenly left this port some time ago, returned from the North Coast of Cuba. There was great rejoicing in Nassau at her success in running the gauntlet of the Spanish cruisers. All of the men on board of her, together with their arms, ammunition and provisions, were safely landed.

Soon after arriving the Salvador was seized by the Receiver General for violating the Foreign Enlistment act. The government demands £4,000 (\$20,000) for the excess of passengers she took from Nassau.

The people are very indignant at this action on the part of the authorities.

Captain Carlin and several others of the Salvador have arrived in Key West from Nassau.
