

SPAIN TO CUBA.—The Spanish Cortes is engaged in debate on the Cuban question, the rebellion, colonial slavery and the slave trade. Marshal Serrano claims that the Cubans have had all required liberties, even as the Canadians, but that party spirit blinds many of the people to the good intentions of the government in Madrid. General Dulce reported the suppression of the armed insurrection, but stated that a "moral disorder" still remains. When peace is restored in the island the Spanish government will suppress slavery and punish slave traders. An old story and many times repeated. No promise of local reform. Cuba and Canada gravitate towards the centre of freedom and self-government.
