

## Cuba.

Havana despatches of yesterday state that the Spanish iron-clad Victoria had arrived. Another detachment of volunteers was expected from Spain. The Narragansett had returned to Havana from Neviges.

Official despatches have been received from Admiral Hoff to the 16th inst., but they relate entirely to matters of official routine.

The views of Secretary Fish and the President, it is well known, are favorable to the cause of Cuba. Señor Robert some time ago desired an expression from the Secretary condemnatory of the Cuban insurrection, but the Secretary declined to make use of anything of the sort, and coolly informed the Minister that while the laws should be enforced where they benefited Spain, the government and people of this country were, as a body, in strong sympathy with the insurgents.

## St. Thomas.

The two Peruvian iron-clads have left St. Thomas for Martinique.

## Miscellaneous.

In regard to the Quaker City, it is now stated that her destination is Hayti, and she is intended to operate in some way for or against Salnave. Secretary Fish has informed Minister Thornton that he cannot take her case out of the courts, and that, although it may be that she belongs to a British subject, the neutrality laws must be enforced.
