VIA KEY WEST, May 27, 1869, Captain General Dulce Dangerously Ill-Riot Among the Volunteers-A Spanish War Vessel Fires into Spanish Troops-Rumors of Filibusters Landing.

Captain General Dalce is dangerously ill of a cancer and is hourly expected to die. A riot occurred at Fort Cabanas on Saturday night on the occasion of the departure of the prisoners captured on the Galvanic Spain. The volunteers tried to stop their embarkation, and in the mêlée which followed cried, "Death to Dulce !" Further outrages were prevented

by the supplications of the Governor of the fortress and the prisoners were allowed to proceed. A Spanish steamer in the bay of Nipe fired by mis-

take into some Spanish troops on the shore. It is

reported that forty men were killed. The Spaniards are greatly excited by the frequent reports of the landing of flubustering expeditions.
