

## The Captured Cuban Flag.

NEW YORK, May 27, 1862.

TO THE EDITOR OF THE HERALD:—

The telegraph from Cuba the past two days has been asserting, by permission of the Spanish censor at Havana, that the Cuban flag which Mrs. Emilia C. de Villaverde presented to *Riferos de la Libertad* in this city on the 27th of April last was captured by the Spaniards in the encounter with the patriots near the Bay of Nipe. Supposing this to be true, which is very doubtful, I can assure you that the event has not in the least discouraged the lady, as I know that she is already engaged in embroidering a new and handsomer flag for the next expedition. I know also that she does not believe the Spanish report of the affair at Nipe; but if it were so she is willing and able to make as many as may be wanted until planted in the Morro Castle.
