Interview Between the Spanish Consul and General Barlow.

The Spanish Consul visited the United States Marshal's office yesterday and had an interview with the Marshal. The former gentleman having announced himself, he was immediately invited into the Marshal's sanctum, where he remained half an hour. General Barlow is properly very reticent as to the details of the conversation, but admits that the points forming the Cuban sensation of the day were the basis thereof. General Barlow added, when courteously pressed upon the subject by the HERALD reporter, that no human being but himself and the Spanish Consul are in the slightest degree conversant with what transpired at the interview, and every sensational rumor that may appear in connection therewith, of special despatches from Washington on Cuban affairs, and secret action on his part for the preservation of the neutrality laws, will be but the coinage of the brains of the writers indulging therein. All that occurred at the interview referred to is known only to the two gentlemen themselves.
