Conservative Meeting in Richmond—Enlistment of Volunteers for Cuba.

RICHMOND, June 15, 1869.

A mass meeting of conservatives was held here this afternoon. The business houses were closed and about 4,000 people assembled in the park. The tenor of the speeches made was that while neither negro suffrage nor even the expurgated constitution was desirable yet all should be accepted, that the State might again return to the Union, and peace and prosperity be restored. The claims of Mr. Walker, the conservative republican candidate for Governor, were urged, and recognized with enthusiasm by the audience.

A recruiting office for soldiers at thirty dollars a month and bounty has been opened here. It is understood they are to be enlisted for the Cuban cause.
