

## An Acceptance.

Having translated from the *Libertad* and published the card of several Cuban residents in reference to the New York *Cronica's* account of the Cuban-Spanish duel, it is not easy, though contrary to rule to avoid yielding to the request of the gentleman whose name is given below that his answer should also be inserted. His card is as follows:—

To the signers of the communication and challenge which appeared yesterday in the organ of the Cuban insurrection, *La Libertad*:—

The undersigned, though not the author of the letter published in the New York *Cronica*, to which the above parties refer, and not doubting but that the writer of said letter will answer for himself, as in duty bound, the undersigned accepts the responsibility of the provocation and challenge of Messrs. Frederico Gil Marrero and José Vinet (the social position of P. Sabio making his challenge unacceptable).

Should Messrs. Gil Marrero and Jose Vinet find in the above the expected answer to their communication they can call daily, from twelve M. to three P. M., and from seven to ten P. M., at the Bismarck coffee house, where the undersigned will be willing to grant them whatever satisfaction they may require.
