The War on the Cubans—Arrest and Commitment of General Golcouria.

The United States vs. General Golcouria.—The defendant is charged with being the principal in getting up the expedition which sailed from here on Saturday night last. He was arrested Monday evening and was yesterday brought up for examination. There was a large number of Cubans and others interested in the Cuban movement in court.

The case being called on Mr. Bell said the General was arrested on a charge of fitting out an expedition for Cuba, and he was ready to have him admitted to bail.

Mr. Elankman said that the prisoner could not be held to bail on suspicion of attempting to commit an offence or of violating the neutrality laws.

The Commissioner, however, held otherwise, and ordered that the General give \$5,000 bail to answer the charge, and \$3,000 to keep the peace. Bail was subsequently given and the defendant discharged.
