General De Rodas Counts on the Aid of Fifty Thousand Volunteers to Suppress the Revolution—General Lesca Pursuing Insurgents.

HAVANA, June 29, 1859.

Don Espinar, late Acting Captain General, gave a dinner yesterday in honor of General De Rodas. The latter made a speech. He declared that he came to the island counting on the aid of 50,000 volunteers in the suppression of the rebellion.

Complete harmony exists between the new Captain General and the volunteers.

The Spanish Admiral has returned from a cruise.

General Lesca is actively pursuing the bands of insurgents in the Ciego Villas district, and has frequent encounters with them. The *Diario* says he places the volunteer cavalry, composed of native Cubans, in the front rank, as the defenders of the integrity of the island.

It is supposed that the insurgents executed the entire company of Spanish soldiers captured at Sabana Nueva. The charred corpse of a Spanish officer was found in the ruins of one of the houses.
