
**Safe Arrival of General Jordan and the
Filibusters in the Insurgent Camp—The
Spaniards Repulsed by Them Everywhere.**

WASHINGTON, June 3, 1869.

Letters from Cuba received here this morning by Cuban sympathizers state that the force under General Jordan had succeeded in joining the Cuban forces after several fights, in all of which the Spaniards were repulsed with serious losses. It is stated that the losses of Jordan were slight, not over forty-five in killed and wounded, and that he saved his artillery and arms and ammunition. He had with him 1,700 new rifles of the most approved pattern.
