Spanish Account of the Battle at Nipe Baynition and Supplies Captured.

Filibusters Surprised-Their Arms, Ammu-

WASHINGTON, June 6, 1869. A letter from a Spanish source which may be regarded as semi-official, dated Havana, May 20, speaks of a recent encounter with fillbusters in the Bay of Nipe, somewhere about the 11th of May. They were, it is said, surprised and dispersed by one of the Spanish military columns. Three or four of the invadors, designated as roreigners, the only prison-

ers taken, were summartly shot. It is added that the cargo of the vessel in which the flitbusters landed fell into the hands of the Spaniards. It consisted of twelve pieces of artillery, 150,000 cartridges, with other ammunition, and a large number of barrels of

hard bread and potatoes.
