Arrest of Dealers in Manzanillo—Address of Loyal Cubans to the Patriots—Reported Defeat and Wounding of General Jordan.

HAVANA, July 21, 1900.

Dealers have been arrested in Manzanillo for selling goods to the rebels.

The loyal Cubans of San Espiritu have issued an address to their misguided rebel brethren, urging them to return to their allegiance.

The insurgents, 800 strong, under General Jordan, have been defeated with heavy loss. General Jordan was wounded.

There is a better feeling in the sugar market, and lower grades have improved most. Prices are still, but quotations are unchanged. Exchange on United States, short sight, in gold, 4 a 5 per cent premium.

Arrival of United States Vessels at Santiago—Engagement With the Patriots Near the City.

HAVANA, July 21, 1900.

Late advices have been received from Santiago de Cuba. On the 11th instant the American war steamers Albany, Gettysburg and Centaur arrived at that port. Admiral Hoff and the officers of the fleet paid a visit to the Commander of the Eastern Department.

Major Rk W. with sixty men of the Spanish troops, had had a sharp engagement with the Cubans near Manzanillo. Twenty of the latter were killed and twelve captured. The Spanish loss was not given.
