Active Operations on All Sides—Fighting at Various Points—The Result According to Spanish Accounts—The Patriots Again Between Villa Clara and Sagua La Grande.

HAVANA, July 24, 1863.

The volunteers from Remedios have surprised a force of rebels at Laguna, and killed eighteen of them.

A skirmish has also occurred between Sagua and Villa Clara, in which the rebels lost twenty men, including Major Marquez.

Advices from Santi Espirita state that 200 troops had captured a rebel intrenchment, with considerable loss on both sides.

A force of 800 rebels had attacked the colored militia guarding the railroad between Nuevitas and Puerto Principe with the loss of forty men. The Spanish loss was ten.

Number of Spaniards and Patriots in the Field—Government Stipend Withheld from the Jesuit College.

HAVANA, July 25, 1863.

According to official reports the number of effective regular troops on this island is thirty-two thousand, and of volunteers four thousand.

The rebels state that they have six thousand well-armed men in the field, besides a number of guerilla bands.

Marshal Serrano has issued an order withholding the government stipend from the Jesuit College in Havana, owing to the indiscretion of the directors.
