British Steamer Overhauled on Suspicion of Violating the Neutrality Laws.

BALTIMORE, July 27, 1869.

The British steamer Lord Lovell, which cleared from this port on Friday last for Havana, laden heavily with coal and empty sugar hogsheads, was overhauled on Saturday evening off Cape Henry by the revenue cutter Northerner, Captain McGowan, by orders from Washington, on suspicion of being engaged in carrying arms, &c., to Cuba in the interest of the revolutionists. After a thorough search she was released, nothing being found to justify her seizure.
