Advices from the revolutionists to the 22d inst. state that they have possession of the principal points on the coast and can hold them against any force the Spaniards can bring against them. They claim that if they were accorded belligerent rights by the United States they would have possession of the entire island outside of Havana in thirty days. A Spanish force of 400 from Santiago de Cuba was captured by General Jordan. Heavy reinforcements were despatched to their aid, but the reinforcements were in turn attacked and defeated with a loss of half their number. A cargo of slaves recently landed were captured by the Cubans, who at once liberated their prisoners.
