**Accident to Colonel Lopez Camara—Departure
of Troops to Barajagua—Political Prisoners
Sent to Bayamo.**

SANTIAGO, July 30, 1869.

Lieutenant Colonel Rebull, second under Colonel Lopez Camara, went foraging for provisions with forty volunteers and ten regulars, of Leon, and in an encounter with a rebel party killed three and captured some arms.

Colonel Machado left Mayari on the 11th for Barajagua, and his column of Reas Chasseurs had four encounters during the journey, killing in all seven rebels, wounding many and capturing many arms. He had only two wounded. The wards of Barajagua, Mejia and Guira were freed from all rebel incursions.

Colonel Lopez Camara has dislocated his leg on horseback, but is almost recovered. The *Bandera Española* contains an official communication from Lopez Camara, dated the 25th, giving the account of Rebull's sally for provisions.

The only military movement of late was the exit of Colonel Quiro, with 400 men and four cannon, to operate in combination with Lieutenant Colonel Muñoz Torrerá and attack the rebels of Barajagua.

Several political prisoners leave in the steamer for Manzanillo, to be placed at the disposition of General Valmaseda in Bayamo. An important case has been initiated there, which requires their presence.
