There were two arrivals at Quarantine during the nast day or two of vessels which had come in contact with relicw jack either before or after they had left their ports of departure. The first was the bark

Coba Captain Prince, from Havana. She had six men in hospital at Havana down with vellow feverand two, the mate, Robert Furnham, and a seaman named Corie, died of the disease. The remainder of the crew came on with the vessal. During the passame the cantain a son, aged nine years, died of the disease. Two of the craw were taken down with the

fever also on the voyage, but they are now conyaleacent. The Faitule, from Rio Janeiro, which left that port on the 11th of June and put into Hampton Roads for orders on the 2d of August, and sailed thence for this port on the 16th mat. was also unfortunate. She left two of her craw and her captain at Rio sick with yellow fever, and three others were prostrated by the disease during the voyage. Both these vessels are now detained at lower

quarantine.
