

The London Times on the Cuban Question.

LONDON, August 23, 1869.

The Paris correspondent of the *Times* writes as follows on the subject of the Cuban question:—

Most of the Spaniards are sanguine of preserving Cuba. There is much disappointment manifested at the small success in repressing the rebellion there. The argument that Cuba is a loss and not a gain to Spain is absurd. Spain is benefited largely by the productiveness and commerce of Cuba.

The correspondent thinks that the immediate annexation of Cuba to the United States is not desired by the American government, but that England or France are not likely to offer any opposition to the scheme.
