Assassination of Citizens—Alarm and Excitement—Another Battle—War Manifestations from Mexico.

HAVANA, August 26. }
Via Key West, Fla., August 27, 1869. }

Advices have been received here from Santiago, dated to the evening of Saturday last. Intense excitement and alarm continue to prevail there and in the surrounding neighborhood in consequence of the news of the assassination of some citizens when travelling under escort near Jiguaní.

There is no security for life or property. Finkler and Cisneros, with other prominent insurgents, succeeded in leaving Santiago during the night of the 1st instant, taking with them a large quantity of specie. After marching a short distance they encountered the troops of Sabanilla, who had been ambushed by the way. An engagement ensued. The insurgent forces held the field. The troops returned to Guantanamo, reporting the loss of twelve men.

They also reported the events of two recent landings of revolutionary sympathizers in the bay of Nipe, bringing arms and ammunition from Mexico for the use of the revolutionists.
