**Arrest of an American—Colored Troops Off
Nuevitas—Puerto Principe Well Supplied
with Provisions—Skirmishes at Various
Points.**

HAVANA, August 2, 1898.

Mr. Valls, a relative of the American Consul at Sagua la Grande, has been arrested and sent to Havana.

Four hundred colored soldiers have left in the Spanish merchant steamer Barcelona for Nuevitas. The same men composed a portion of the last Spanish expedition to Mexico.

Advices from Puerto Principe represent that the garrison were abundantly supplied with provisions.

Skirmishes are reported at Santi Espirita, Villa Clara and Trinidad, in which the Spanish troops were successful.
