The Mails Detained and Suspected Letters Registered—The Lieutenant Governor of Bayamo Found Guilty of Treason.

HAVANA, Sept. 11, 1892.

It having become known that suspected parties were about to deposit letters for the United States the mails by the steamship Missouri were detained and the letters, which are supposed to contain rebel intelligence, were registered.

The court martial in the case of Udalta, Lieutenant Governor of Bayamo, at the outbreak of the rebellion, have found him guilty of treason, and he has been sentenced to the chain gang for ten years.
