General Sickness' Cuban Proposition.

PARIS, Sept. 12, 1869.

It is reported here that General Sickness' late note to the Spanish government declares that though the United States have not yet recognized the insurgents in Cuba as belligerents, still, if the situation there is not modified soon they will take steps to that end.

Reinforcements for Cuba.

PARIS, Sept. 12, 1869.

Spain is about to despatch 24,000 reinforcements to Cuba. The first detachment, 6,000 strong, will embark during the present week.

Money Aid for the Military.

The *Imparcial* (newspaper) confirms the report that 24,000 soldiers will be sent to Cuba, and states that the merchants of Havana have raised 9,000,000 reals for their pay.
