Actions of the Railroad Men in This City.

A number of gentlemen connected with railroad offices assembled at the Astor House yesterday, pur-

suing to a former adjournment, and paid in their subscriptions to the Avondale fund to their Treasurer, Mr. J. S. Sosseler, who announced that the sum of \$700 had been received. The total amount collected by the railroad employees will reach \$2,000, but it will not be all paid in before Saturday next, when it will be forwarded for the relief of the sufferers by the Avondale calamity.

Subscriptions in Jersey City and Newark.

The amount subscribed by two thirds of the employees of the New Jersey Railroad Company to the Avondale fund is \$1,123.41. Every man, even the poorest laborer, generously contributed one day's pay. When the collection is complete the amount from this railroad will reach nearly \$2,000.

At noon yesterday the subscription list for the Avondale sufferers in Newark was closed at the Mayor's office. The total amount footed up \$743.65.
