#### General Sickles' Notes—Newspaper Excitement—Another Frigate for Cuba.

MADRID, Sept. 18, 1869.

The Spanish press has been in a complete ferment of excitement and indignation since the presentation of General Sickles' notes to the government. Some of the journals abuse the American Minister badly. They say he was sent here solely because he was known to be a strong partizan of Cuban annexation. General Sickles emphatically denies the assertion that his mission refers only to Cuba. He insists that he has never broached the question of the cession of the island to the United States, but has merely hinted that the American government is willing to interpose its friendly offices for the settlement of Spain's difficulties with Cuba.

The proposition to call Prince Thomas, the young Duke of Genoa and nephew of King Victor Emanuel, to the throne of Spain under the joint regency of Montpensier, Serrano and Rivero is gaining ground.

The Spanish frigate *Amanza* is under orders for Cuba.
