

## **The Blockade Runner Lillian Back in New Orleans and Detained by Government—Alleged Sufferings of the Filibusters.**

**NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 13, 1863.**

The blockade runner Lillian, whose escape from New Orleans and intended destination for Cuba were specially telegraphed to the HERALD, was seriously disabled by the gale, and is now back in this city in dock. By orders received from the Attorney General she will not again be allowed to leave. There are no tangible outward marks of suspicion to justify seizure, but the Custom House officials oppose *vis inertia* to her clearance. Meanwhile the filibusters who were to have been taken aboard the Lillian at a point on the coast of Florida are said to be suffering severely for want of the stores which the Lillian had in her hold.

• The Teazer, sister ship to the Lillian, may possibly be despatched to their relief,—that is if she can get away.
