A letter from an ex-member of the Confederate Congress, now in Cuba, states that dissensions, incited by jealousy or Spanish gold, have compelled the reorganization of the patriot army. The brothers Marcato, Dominicans by birth, each holding a general's commission in the Cuban army, have been assassinated, because they were of foreign birth. It is feared this dastardly outrage may result in serious disaster.
