The newspapers in Havana cite the enlistment of filibusters in the United States as proof that the great mass of the native Cubans are loyal, or else they would be willing to fight their own battles. The Spanish element claims that rebellions do not admit of mediation, and the Washington government has no right to interfere. The Spanish volunteers have again offered to take the field, but Captain General De Rodas declined their services. A report is published in a Havana despatch that General Jordan had offered to surrender his whole command for a consideration, but De Rodas had refused the terms.
