LONDON, Sept. 29, 1869.

The London Times' Paris correspondent asserts that there is but little hope of a compromise between Spain and the Cubans. The sentiments of both parties are heard here. The Spanish government says in so many words, "Lay down your arms and send deputies to the Cortes. If you will be as Canada we are willing; if you desire independence we don't say no. The matter may be arranged, but disarm. Spain's motto is, 'Nothing by compulsion.' "
