Supposed Filibustering Steamer at New Orleans—Spanish Detectives Watching Her—Her Ostensible Destination—Considerable Excitement.

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 3, 1862.

The Clyde-built blockade runner Lillian is lying at the levee in the lower part of the city with steam up. She has taken on board thirty days' coal and thirty days' provisions, as well as a double crew. Her cargo is a mystery. Six Spanish detectives are watching her.

Her ostensible destination is Cedar Keys, Fla.; but it is believed that she will try to steal away in the night and bring up off the Cuban coast.

There is considerable excitement here about her.
