CAPTURE OF A BRITISH SCHOONER WITH CUBAN REVOLUTIONISTS ON BOARD—ALL THEATERS IN HAVANA CLOSED.

HAVANA, Jan. 28.—The Spanish man-of-war Venandito, after a sharp chase, captured near Romana Key, an English schooner hailing from Nassau. A party of 22 native Cubans were found on board the vessel. They were on their way to join the insurgents on this island. It is reported that during the chase the men on the schooner, seeing that capture was inevitable, threw overboard a quantity of arms and ammunition. Spanish accounts continue to represent that the insurgents in the Eastern Department in large numbers are presenting themselves to the authorities and claiming the benefits of the amnesty proclamation. The wrecking schooner Arrieta, seized on suspicion, has, after investigation, been released, there being no evidence that she was engaged in carrying supplies to the rebels. The charges against Captain Adams of the steamer Morro Castle, for carrying passengers without passports, have been dismissed. Since the recent disturbances in the city the theaters and all other places of public amusement have been closed.
