Both the authorities and the Spanish residents have become maddened by the heroic resistance of the Cubans, and threaten the insurgents and their sympathizers with a policy of extermination. They are in a frame of mind which is very likely to lead them on to grave excesses not only against the Cubans, but against foreign residents who sympathize with the revolution. Our Covernment, we trust, will see that our fellow citizens in Cuba promptly and efficiently receive all the protection to which they are entitled by law. The news about the movements of the insurgents continues to be very favorable. Their number is steadily increasing; more and more the native population
