

## RELIEF FOR CUBA.

The Cuban Relief Committees of this city on Saturday issued an address to be sent to the pastor of every church in the land, appealing "to the friends of humanity, and to all Christian people in this favored land for their sympathies and fervent prayers, that the God of Hosts, who helped your fathers to break the yoke of foreign oppression, and blessed you, their children, with this goodly land for an heritage—at once the envy and admiration of the world—may so in like manner, sustain and uphold our husbands, sons and brothers, in their present heroic struggles, sacrifices and sufferings, that they, too, may triumph, both morally and materially, over the cruel tyranny, wrongs and outrages of the past and of the present; and that by the aid of God, and with the full and complete establishment of true religious freedom, civil, social and political liberty may evermore prevail in Cuba." The patriotism shown by the Cuban refugees and residents is not generally known. Many who escaped from the Island with only their plate and jewels have given these to advance the cause. Others have given largely from their private fortunes, one gentleman giving \$30,000. The Junta Patriótica de Cubanos of this city has already raised \$10,000 for the relief of the sick and wounded, and is constantly enlarging its labors. A committee of ladies will go to Washington to-day to organize a "Junta" there. From their entertainment at Irving Hall on Saturday evening they cleared \$2,500. A Sacred Concert will be given under the auspices of the Catholic Committee this evening, the proceeds of which will be placed in the common treasury.
