Even the Spanish accounts from Cube now indicate that the revolution is caining cround. The Diario of Havana, a fanatical organ of the Spanish party, makes in portant admissions. It reports a rapid increase of revolutionary forces at Mayari in the Lastern, and near Cienfregos and Palmillos in the Central Department. It mentions another engagement near Santo D-piritu, which is not claimed as a victory. It indicates that the whole of the Samua district is in the hands of the Cubana and that all the Spanish planters have found it necessary to seek refuge in the towns. Another dispatch speaks of a rapid increase of insurgents near Remedios. All this proves that the insurrection is not surported merely by a few isolated bands, but that the people of Caba are in arms

for the recovery of their independence.
