## CUBA.

### TWO VOLUNTEERS TRIED AND CONVICTED.

HAVANA, March 31.—Two volunteers have been tried and convicted of committing excesses on Sunday last, and have been sentenced to exile and imprisonment. The reports of the recapture of the steamer Comanditario are not confirmed.

### AN ENGLISH CAPTAIN THROWN INTO JAIL—OUTRAGES OF THE VOLUNTEERS—LANDING OF MEN ON THE NORTHERN COAST—ACTIVITY OF THE CUBANS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD OF NUEVITAS.

HAVANA, March 30, via KEY WEST, March 31.—The British Consul has sent the gunboat Heron to Calbarien, where the British ship Jeff Davis, captured by a Spanish cruiser, has arrived. The volunteers at Calbarien seized two Cuban passengers, Rafael Falero and Francisco Jimenez, as they landed from the Jeff Davis, and immediately shot them. The Captain and crew have been thrown into jail. The British Consul expects to have a British fleet soon cruising in the Bahamas. Two steamers and two schooners have landed men and arms at Cape Maisi, the extreme eastern point of the island. Advices from Santiago to the 23d report that the steamer Cricket and two schooners had landed expeditions on the northern shore. Lopez had returned from Mayari. News had been received from Nuevitas to the 21th. The insurgents were very active in the vicinity. The Government troops had reoccupied Manotí, and expect to restore communications with Tunas.

### THE PERUVIAN MONITORS IN THE SERVICE OF THE CUBANS.

KEY WEST, Fla., March 31.—Information from most reliable sources has been received here that the so-called Peruvian monitors are really in the service of the Cuban revolutionists, and it is believed they are now in the vicinity of Manzanillo.

## GREAT BRITAIN.

### CONFERENCE ON THE IRISH CHURCH QUESTION.

DUBLIN, March 31.—The Dublin Synod met at St. Patrick's Cathedral to-day, and elected delegates to the Conference on the Irish Church question.

## BAVARIA.

### REDUCTION OF THE ARMY.

MUNICH, March 31.—Orders have been issued granting unlimited leave of absence to 50 men of each company in all the infantry regiment of the Bavarian Army.

## GREECE.

### THE CHAMBER DISSOLVED.

ATHENS, March 31.—The Greek Chambers have been dissolved. Elections will be held on the 16th of May for the new Legislature, which will assemble on the 5th of June. The Turkish Ambassador has presented his credentials to the King.

## SPAIN.

### THE NEW LOAN VOTED—THE CONSCRIPTION LAW.

MADRID, March 31.—In the Constituent Cortes, yesterday, the new loan required by the Provisional Government was voted. The hostility to the Conscription law continues in the Provinces, and fresh outbreaks are apprehended.
