DECREE OF CONFISCATION—EXECUTION OF A CUBAN LEADER.

HAVANA, April 16.—In consequence of the appearance in New-York of a document issued and signed by Morales Lemus, imposing a contribution on Cuban refugees for the support of the revolutionary cause, Gen. Dulce has issued a proclamation ordering the seizure of all property belonging to the Lemus, Leon Casanova, Mestre Bramosio, Cisneros, Criardo, and others, unless they produce the necessary proofs that they have complied with the legal requirements in the transfer of their property to other parties. The Cuban leader Adulcere has been captured and executed at Manzanilla. It is reported that a schooner with a cargo of arms has been captured near the mouth of Mantua River, at the western end of the island, while trying to run the blockade. The hotel Inglatarra took fire last night and was totally destroyed.

THE NEW-ORLEANS CUBAN EXPEDITION—SEIZURE OF A VESSEL.

NEW-ORLEANS, April 16.—The brig H. B. Colson was yesterday seized by Collector Casey, for alleged violation of the revenue laws, and because it was alleged she had on board arms for Cuba. The investigation revealed an attempt to defraud the insurance companies, the Captain stating that he had been offered \$5,000 to take the vessel to sea and destroy her.
