

A collaborator of the *Revolucion*, the organ of Cuba, established here by perhaps the ablest of all her journalists, Nestor Ponce de Leon, has undertaken to figure up the total losses of the insurgents, as told from day to day in the Spanish papers. His record takes us from the beginning of the war to the end of April last. In this period the Spaniards, by their own showing, have dealt death, wounds, and privations to their victims at the following rate:

This compilation has, we understand, been carefully, and even indulgently, calculated out of the Havana papers. Were his figures correct, more men would have been put out of battle than until of late months have figured in it—in other words, about half of the whole Cuban organization, armed or unarmed, as reported in February. The breed of Federal is not yet dead. We are curious to understand why their capture of machetes, the most popular arm of the Cuban, is so out of all proportion to the number of the killed, the array of wounded and prisoners, the multitude of the horses, the legion of the surrendered!
