

The West Indies repeat a familiar story. Salvare has attacked a town and been repulsed. Gov. Sans, awaiting the arrival of Gen. Caballero in Porto Rico, is stealing letters. New landings of aid have occurred in Cuba, and it is said that Gen. Jordan has now with him two thousand men from the United States. The recognition given to Cuba by Peru is a disclaimer, apparently, of any intention to treat with Spain in the Spanish-American Conference appointed for this month. From Havana we have news of a severe battle at Puerto Padre, and the loss of an expedition of filibusters. If the Spanish report be true, the Cubans have lost one of their best Generals, Donato del Marmol.
