The arrest of the members of the Cuban Junta, at the instigation of the Spanish authorities, and on the information of Spanish spies, will give great delight to that small but malignant party in this city (of which the leading Democratic journal is the fitting representative), which finds nothing but cause for regret in the prospect for the speedy liberation of Cuba. Beyond the gratification

giran to this party-which certainly has

had little other gratification of late—the proceedings are of no particular consequence. The cause of Cuban independence no longer rests on the fato or power of any New-York sympathizers.
