"You observe now a continued emigration "from Cuba," says Gen. Caballero de Rodas. We suppose it has entered into the head of the Captain-General that his own countrymen may join this tide of retreat. The fact we have given is the most important of one of the Captain-General's proclamations. Another proclamation closes all the minor ports of the east end of the island, and declares, with special injunction that Spanish commanders shall be careful of international rights. that all filibuster vessels are pirates. This proclamation mainly reiterates that of Dulca some months back. Thanks to the new dis-

position of the Navy, we shall have a sufficient fleet in Cuban waters to make good any demand for indemnity in the case of Americans already injured or slain, and to protect American interests generally.
