An Engagement at Clenfuegos-Surrender of Rebels at Villa Clara-Advance of General Preparing to Attack Quesada.

HAVANA, March I —General Duello, with his commund, has arrived at Santa Espiritu, from Cien fuegos

The Diarlo reports an engagement between the troops and insurgents, at the town of Cienfuegos, in which the troops was victorious. The same paper states that three hundred rebels have surtendered at Villa Clara.
