**The Cuban Insurrection—More Political Exiles—
Riot in Havana—Insurgents Concentrating, &c.**

HAVANA, March 13.—The *Vos de Cuba* newspaper publishes the following: "A second expedition will soon be sent to Fernando Po with prisoners convicted of political offences against the Government."

A riot occurred to-day in Figueras street. Several of the participants were arrested and sentenced, one of them to death, and another to carry a ball and chain during the remainder of his life.

KEY WEST, FLA., March 13.—Despatches from Havana, dated 11th instant, say that the insurgent leaders propose concentrating their forces and establishing their seat of government at Mayari or some town in the jurisdiction of Santiago. Aid is expected shortly from Yucatan and other places.

An iron-clad, with Armstrong guns for the insurgents, had been sighted off Green Key, and Spanish cruisers were immediately sent to search for her.

The Governor has refused to permit Cubans or Americans to leave the country.

The troops have committed many outrages on the plantations in the neighborhood of Nuevitas.

REVOLUTIONARY DECREE ABOLISHING SLAVERY IN CUBA.

HAVANA, March 13, via KEY WEST, March 14.—The Cuban revolutionary assembly, which has convened in the central department, has decreed, by and with the advice and consent of the military commanders, the immediate and unconditional abolition of slavery. This action will tend greatly to strengthen the Cuban cause at home and abroad.

NEW YORK, March 14.—The *Tribune* Havana special gives the substance of the Cuban abolition proclamation as follows: Slavery brought to Cuba by Spanish domination ought to be extinguished with it. The Central Assembly, therefore, decrees—first, the abolition of slavery; second, opportune indemnification; third, freedmen to bear arms; fourth, freedmen to have the rights and privileges of white men; fifth, all patriots, whatever their color, are under the same obligations to the cause. The decree is signed by Cisneros, and issued by Gen. Castillo.

REPORTED BATTLE IN CUBA.

HAVANA, March 14.—Official despatches report a battle at Mayari, the headquarters of the insurgents in the Eastern department. The official account states that a column of 500 regular troops, supported by a heavy artillery are, carried the fortifications of Mayari and captured the town, which was defended by 2,000 insurgents. No rebel version of the affair has been received.
