## From Cuba.

Washington, July 2.—The Cubans here have the following advices:

Villas District they were reinforced by two thousand troops, making the Spanish forces double the Cuban forces, and compelling the Cubans to retreat. Eighty-five Cubans, including several Americans were captured, whom Lesca shot. Nearly all the large plantations in the Cinco Villas District were destroyed. It is stated that the Cubans are concentrating to fight Lesca, and news of a decisive battle is daily expected. The Cubans are uneasy in not hearing from Jordan.

New York, July 2.—Puerto Principe advices of June 22d report the condition of the Spanish troops as being dreadful. The hospitals are full, and ten deaths take place daily. A foraging party one hundred and fifty strong were driven into the city, forty of whom went into the hospital. The Cubans captured a hundred Regulars at the first station from Principe. One regiment of volunteers has two hundred sick. Quesada is in the vicinity. The Spaniards attribute his success to the acquisition of the filibusters, and state that forty thousand more troops are necessary.

HAVANA, July 2.—The Catalon volunteers, guarding the Neuvitas Railroad, have mutinied. Their Colonel has been arrested by the order of Letoria.

The Puerto Principe volunteers marched on Puerto Principe, rescued their Colonel, and imprisoned by Letoria, who will probably be shot.

Rodas, in a public speech, to-day, advised the journalists to show more moderation and endeavor to conciliate all classes, and cease publishing irritating articles; especially regarding ladies.
