

## Aid for the Cubans—Departure of Another Vessel.

The brig *Timothy Field*, with a Cuban crew, 2,000 muskets and eight field pieces—10-pounders—sailed from this port for a rendezvous with the *Anna*, on the evening of the 3d inst. Clearance was asked for her at the Custom House on the 1st ultimo, but the Collector refused to give it until the United States Marshal should first visit the brig and decide whether she was equipped for carrying an expedition of men or not. The following day being New Year's and Sabbath succeeding, there was no remedy but to delay the Marshal's visit until Monday, the 3d inst. Marshall HARLOW then went on board the brig and certified that there were no accommodations for men on the vessel. The master, A. W. EMMONS, then gave clearance bonds, which were also signed by Mr. GEO. BROWN. The brig sailed and will transfer her arms to the *Anna* in the neighborhood of some of the Bahama Islands.
