

## **Singular Charge of Stealing a Cuban Flag.**

In December last a steamer was fitted out in this City with arms and ammunition for the struggling Cubans, and, having successfully eluded the intervention of the United States authorities, proceeded toward her destination. Like many similar expeditions, it was unable to effect a landing on the shores of Cuba, and was obliged to put into the port of Nassau, where it was seized by the British authorities. A sale of the ship's effects followed, and among the articles disposed of was a valuable flag, which was presented to the Cubans by Señor CEREDI VILLA VERDI, a resident of this City. It was purchased by Señor DIAGO DIAZ, a Cuban, residing in Nassau, and brought by him to this City about a month since. By an accidental circumstance it came to the knowledge of Señor VILLA VERDI that Señor DIAZ had the flag in his possession, and on demanding it, being refused, he brought a charge of larceny against the latter at the Essex Market Police Court yesterday. The flag being emphatically claimed by both parties, Judge SCOTT, who presided, dismissed the complaint and ordered the flag to be transmitted to the Property Clerk, at Police Headquarters, for the purpose of identification by witnesses.
