The Scizure of the Steamer Appinwall— Demand Upon Spain for Indemnity.

It is understood that the position taken by the Spanish government in relation to the seizure of the Aspinwall is that the vessel was taken under supplicion of having; landed arms in Cuba. Schor Roberts has not as yet made any reply to

the communication some weeks since. The position of the United States government

is that the Aspinwall was selted on the high seas and not in Cuban waters, and therefore it was that the Spanish government nad no right to make the selture even had the Aspinwall beer engaged in carrjing arms, which, nuder the circumstances, the United States not being at war with Spain, were not contraband articles. The govern-

ment will hold to its original demand for the release of the vessel and an indemnity for her detention.
