CUBA. Rese-Colored Despetches from De Rodus— Frerything Lovely for the Spaulards—Ca-

bans Organizing to Take the Field—General Jordan Reported to Have Certainly Fied— Ceepedes Somewhere or Other—Colonel Ryan Fighting Ducis.

Official de-patches have becareceated from Cap-

tion General De Rodas, at Puerco Principe, announcing a great reaction in the insurrectionary districts in favor of the Spaniards. The presentations of persons to the Spaniah authorities for protection continues. The columns of Spanish troops had left Puerto Principe, with instructions to divide into small parties. Each column was under sealed orders

from the Captain General.

The rebel General Agramonte lately hung a man'to a tree on the road leading into Paerto Principe, with the inscription pinned to him—"Executed for trying to surrender."

The towns of Cascorto, Sibanicu and Gualmaro

The towns of Cascorro, Sibanicu and Gualmaro have been strongly fortified by the Spanish troops. Companies of volunteers are being organized in those towns, which will be composed entirely of Cuoans, and as soon as they are equipped with pro-

those towns, which will be composed entirely of Cunans, and as soon as they are equipped will proceed to the field.

Two hundred Spanlards from the garrison of Puerto Principe marches into the town of Satta Cruiz, where they captured and executed three rebot coloness, named Recio, Cancio and Medina.

The Spanish despatches report that the rebell General Jordan has certainly ded the country, and that the main body of insurgenia, consisting of 800 men, are commanned by General Agramonto.

These despatches also state that the Cuban Congress had been dissolved.

Cuban families who surrendered to the Spanish authorities at Arenas state that President Cespedas had abandoned the region of Las Tuffas and had retired, with about a dozen of his followers, to the Camagutie region.

Spanish convoys of provisions now reach the town of Las Tuñas without molestation by the insurgents.

A boiler on the Precioso plantation, near Carde-

A boiler on the Precioso plantation, near Cardenas, lateiy exploded, killing nine and wounding fitten of the hands employed and completely demoishing the boiler house.
