His gulant conduct on the occasion commanded the admiration of even the Spinlards, and he was treated with much re-pert. He was taken to Havana a id senter coulto hard Liber at Ceuto, but he soon escaped and came to the United State-, where he remained a few months, salling again for Cuba wit a despatches fo Cespedes in Feuruary la.t. He reached him in -a etv. and was about returning again to this country, when he was captured and met with his untimely end.
