The indignity offered to the United States, by compelling its Consul to seek the protection of a friendly Power in order to save his life, is a circumstance which demands the attention of the government. The evil does not rest with this insult alone. It is well known that American citizens have been seized, thrown into

prison, their property destroyed and in many

cases they themselves have been massacred. United States consuls, whose duties are to look after the interests of their countrymen, dare not fulfil the obligations of their positions if they have any regard for their lives. As Mr. Phillips intends to lay his case before his government we hope he will have a full hearing. The outrages perpetrated on Americans are too numerous to be passed over in silence

and the insults offered to the American flag too grievous to be quietly borne any longer.
